# There are many easy ways to **REDUCE HOUSEHOLD WASTE**

With a little planning, thought, and creativity, you can significantly reduce your impact on the environment (and likely your wallet!) by cutting down on trash.

## Reduce your food waste

According to Statistics Canada, food waste accounts for approximately 23% of the residential waste produced by Canadians. An effective way to reduce your food waste is by planning how much food is needed per week. You can do this by taking an inventory of what is within your

refrigerator and by creating shopping lists of what is needed. Not only can this aid you in reducing food waste, but it also can limit overspending on groceries that will not be consumed.

Another way to help reduce food waste is by composting. Composting is the natural breakdown of organic matter to produce a crumbly nutrient-rich soil. Over time your compost pile will shrink up to 75% as it naturally breaks down. The resulting compost can be added to other soil types as fertilizer forming an excellent growing medium for plants. Anyone can compost regardless of the size of your outdoor space.



### Purchase foods with little or no packaging

Fresh fruits and vegetables are normally offered loose in the produce section of grocery stores. Try to

refrain from purchasing produce that is unnecessarily pre-packaged in plastic and/or Styrofoam. You can help limit plastic waste by bringing a reusable produce bag and not using the plastic produce bags that the grocery store provides.



### Recycle

Rinse and flatten acceptable recyclable material and place them into your blue box. By recycling, you are limiting items that would otherwise end up in the landfill and turning them into new products. Conserving natural resources, protecting ecosystems and wildlife, and saving energy are all benefits of recycling.

#### Did you know that garbage collection is one of the most hazardous occupations in Canada?

The Township's Public Works employees are well trained and wear protective clothing, but sometimes injuries occur due to improper disposal of sharp items in curbside garbage. Broken glass is one major hazard that has caused injury to Township employees. Broken glass is NOT recyclable and should be disposed of properly to ensure it makes its way safely to the landfill.



#### **Tips to safely dispose** of BROKEN GLASS

Wrap broken glass in several layers of old cloth.

• Use a hammer to gently break into smaller pieces.

• Place the wrapped glass in a box and seal with strong tape.

• Write DANGER - BROKEN GLASS in large letters on the box.

· Place at the roadside alongside your regular garbage.

#### **Recycle Materials at Landfill Site** Free Access Landfill Pass – Please contact Town Hall or visit our website to request your landfill pass for 2 free loads per year. Free Pass cannot be used to dispose of construction materials.

The Landfill Site is equipped to accept recyclables. If you miss your recycling collection or have a large amount to dispose of, simply bring it to our Landfill site free of charge. Containers have been set up to take cardboard and other recyclables at this location

Please remember to keep cardboard to a maximum size of 1m x 1m x 30cm and do not mix it with other recyclables.

#### **E-Waste at Landfill**

E-waste is accepted at our Landfill Site free of charge. Accepted materials include: computers, keyboards, monitors, and TVs (no wooden consoles).

Did vou know... E-waste can be dropped off at the Habitat for Humanity ReStore Seaway Valley during normal business hours, 7 days a week, 1400 Vincent Massey Dr, Cornwall, 613-938-0413. #### **Tips for Setting Out Your Waste**

- Due to a number of factors, collection times may change. Please be on time and place ALL items at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on vour garbage and recycling day.
- During winter months, ensure that material is free of snow and ice and visible to the collection crew. Do not place materials on top of snowbanks.
- Do not dispose of syringes and needles in your garbage or recycling. It is illegal and dangerous. Please contact your pharmacy or place of purchase for proper disposal methods.

#### GARBAGE

- · Residents may place a maximum limit of two (2) garbage bags / containers per week for collection at the curb. Commercial businesses and registered farms are permitted up to a maximum of six (6) garbage bags / containers per week.
- Only regular household garbage placed in garbage bags or bags within containers with handles, weighing less than 23 kg (50 lbs.), will be collected. Leaf and yard waste will not be accepted with regular garbage collection.
- Avoid accidents and injury. Remember people are handling your waste. Be mindful of the material you place out for collection as well as how it is set out. Wrap broken glass in cloth, break it into smaller pieces with a hammer and put it in a box clearly marked with contents before placing it out for collection.

#### RECYCLING

- Recyclable material is collected every second week on the same day as your garbage. Please refer to the map on the reverse to establish your recycling collection day.
- Bundle and tie all corrugated cardboard in bundles and place beside your Recycling Box.

 Save space and prevent litter; squeeze pop cans, large plastic bottles and beverage. cartons. Remember to bundle and tie cardboard to save space in the truck and to prevent litter on the streets and roadways

- Blue Boxes \$5.00 Composters
- Secure your recyclables. Stack your Recycling Boxes one on top of the other to prevent papers from blowing away.
- Empty and dried paint cans can be placed out for recycling.

## **RECYCLING FACTS**

Recycling one tonne of paper saves 17 trees, 6953 gallons of water, 463 gallons of oil and 583 pounds of air pollution. One pound of newspaper can be recycled to make six cereal boxes, six egg cartons or 2,000 sheets of writing paper. Plastic bottles are infinitely recyclable and can be used to make new bottles, Polar fleece, carpets and car bumpers. An ink cartridge takes 1000 years to bio-degrade.





## **Finance Department**

#### **Property Taxes**

In addition to collecting taxes for our local needs, the Township is responsible for collecting taxes on behalf of the United Counties of SDG as well as the school boards. The interim tax bills are processed in early March with due dates being the last business day of **March and May**. The interim taxes are based on 50% of the previous year's taxes. Once the budgets are finalized for each level of government, the final taxes are calculated. Due dates for final taxes are the **last business day of July and September**.

#### Water/Sewer

Water usage in South Stormont is metered and properties on municipal water/sewer receive invoices quarterly. Meters are read in March, June, September and December. Once invoices are mailed, property owners have 30 days to pay.

Did you know that residents of South Stormont who are on Water/Sewer have the opportunity to register for eBilling? eBilling is when you receive an electronic version of your bill directly to your email inbox instead of a paper bill through traditional mail.

The convenient features and benefits of registering for eBilling are:

- Receiving your Water/Sewer bill fast and securely
- Being able to save or print a PDF version of your bill
- Reducing clutter by having less mail to sort through
- Saving trees and the energy required to print, handle and deliver paper invoices

## **Building Department**

#### When are building permits required?

Building permits are required for, but not limited to; the construction or alteration of any structure over  $10m^2$  ( $107ft^2$ ) in area, a structure of any size containing plumbing, tents over  $60m^2$  ( $645ft^2$ ) and pools.

#### How do I apply for a building permit?

You can apply for a building permit in person at the Township Office (2 Mille Roches Rd., Long Sault) or online with Cloudpermit. The Cloudpermit building permit system allows you to apply for and to see the status of your application anywhere, at any time.

#### Why should I apply for a building permit?

Building permits regulate construction so that health, safety, accessibility and energy efficiency standards are met. Commencing construction without the issuance of a building permit is in contravention of the Building By-law and the Building Code Act of Ontario.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

In 2020, the Township of South Stormont Building Department issued 197 permits facilitating over \$44 million in building activity.

#### When should I apply for a building permit?

It is recommended that you apply for building permits 6-8 weeks prior to the anticipated start date of your project. Although it may not take that long to process your application, it does allow time for unexpected delays due to volume of applications, missing information, conformance with zoning regulations, etc.

#### When and how do I request building inspections?

A list of required inspections is indicated on each building permit. After each stage of construction is completed, building permit holders are required to notify the Township by calling 613-534-8889 Ext. 233 or emailing building@southstormont.ca at least 2 full business days in advance to request an inspection.



#### OPEN AIR AND RECREATIONAL FIRES is defined as the burning of wood, tree limbs and branches

An open air fire is defined as the burning of wood, tree limbs and branches where the flame is not wholly contained. Example include brush fires, windrows and farm/rural practices.

Recreational and cooking fires are fires that burn clean, dry wood for cooking or for pleasure. This type of fire does not require a permit and is permitted within built-up areas in the Township. The fire must be contained in a non-combustible container or fire pit no larger than 46cm X 46cm X 46cm and must always be attended by a responsible adult.

Open air fires that require a permit include:

1. Fire greater than 1 cubic meter. This type of fire must be 30 meters away from any structure or wooded area.

2. Fires for normal farm/rural practices (no larger than 6.5m X6.5m X 2.5m).
 3. Windrows for land clearing. This type of fire has specific regulations – please contact the Township office for full details.

Residents can obtain an Open Air Burn Permit online or at the Township Office. They are valid for a full calendar year (January-December). Permits are valid for the property listed on the permit only. Any additional properties will require separate permits.

## GREEN LIGHTS WHAT DO THEY MEAN?

The Township of South Stormont receives fire protection from local volunteers who often respond to emergencies in their own private



vehicles. These vehicles are not equipped with red lights or sirens that make them stand out from any other vehicle on the road. To help the public identify firefighters responding in their own vehicles, the Ministry of Transportation amended the Highway Traffic Act to allow volunteer firefighters responding to emergencies to use a light that flashed green. If you see a vehicle with a flashing green light activated, you now know it's one of us, on our way to help one of our neighbours. Remember, the home we're rushing to save or life we're going to rescue could be yours, or that of a close friend.


