>>> ST. ANDREWS WEST HERITAGE CENTRE MONUMENT

Don McIntosh from the St. Andrews Parish Committee updated the Council on a newly completed monument in the St. Andrews West Roman Catholic Cemetery.

The monument honors the former Raisin River Heritage Centre and is made from salvaged materials from its 2024 demolition, including bricks, two statues, and two plaques from the original building. Additionally, it features two new commemorative plaques detailing the Heritage Centre's historical significance.



LANDFILL COMPACTOR FIRE

The Director of Infrastructure Services provided a Key Information Report explaining that the compactor at the Trillium Landfill recently caught fire during operations and is now inoperable.

The fire was contained to the equipment and an insurance adjuster has been assigned to the case. Insurance coverage details and repair/replacement costs will be presented after the findings of the investigation have been received.
