



# COUNCIL CATCH UP

## HABITAT FOR HUMANITY LAND DONATION

Council has approved the donation of surplus municipally-owned lands in Long Sault to Habitat for Humanity, along with the waiver of related development fees. This initiative aims to support the construction of two semi-detached homes for partner families of Habitat for Humanity.

The parcels designated for donation are situated on Bethune Ave in Long Sault, conveniently located near commercial amenities, schools, parks, and places of worship.



## FEES AND CHARGES UPDATES

The Fees and Charges By-law is annually reviewed to ensure service costs are reasonable and responsible. These customer-specific costs aim to cover service delivery expenses, reducing the financial burden on tax and user rate payers.

Council approved adjustments to various fees and charges for 2026.



## SOUTH STORMONT SPORTS HALL OF FAME (SSSHOF)

After receiving a request from the SSSHOF in December to explore the possibility of becoming an official Township committee, Council instructed staff to examine potential options and create a Committee Terms of Reference for discussion at a future meeting.

Acknowledging the significance of the SSSHOF, Council is committed to finding a solution that will allow the continued advancement of the SSSHOF's work.



## SOUTH STORMONT FIRE AND RESCUE RECEIVES FIRE PROTECTION GRANT

Council received an update from the Deputy Fire Chief regarding the recent announcement of a successful Fire Protection Grant application for South Stormont Fire and Rescue (SSFR).

In total, SSFR will receive \$65,180 to support cancer prevention, enhanced decontamination processes and lithium-ion battery response equipment.
